## Guidance Department

Elizabeth Hilgert, Student Coordinator/Guidance Counselor As the summer draws to a close, August 14th will be here before we know it, and students will be returning to school. The start of the school year can often be a time of significant anxiety for many students due to various transitions they might be facing. Whether it's moving from kindergarten to first grade, transitioning from elementary to middle school, advancing to a new grade level, or even adjusting to a new home, these changes can be challenging. Our goal is to help each student navigate these transitions smoothly and have a successful school experience. Here are some strategies to ease the anxieties associated with these transitions:
> Focus On The Positives: new friends, new teachers, and new opportunities
> Make a list. If your student if feeling anxious about moving up, create a two-sided list with your child. On one side you can include things your child is looking forward to. On the other, brainstorm things he or she may be anxious about. These lists can start a good conversation, and possibly even give your child a chance to reflect on past challenges he or she has overcome.
> Begin preparations early. Help your child phase in adjustments ahead of time. For example, at the end of a school vacation, start setting bedtime routines earlier to help prepare for the transition back to school.
> Inform the school. Consider any situations or special circumstances that might make it more difficult for your child to transition. Don't forget, the school staff want to help make next year great!
